COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

Your club's committee is a group of a few people who are elected to govern the club on behalf of everybody else.



The ambassador and chair of the meetings



The supporter and strategic planning coordinator





For small clubs, a committee of 3 or 4 people is usually fine. In big clubs, about 9 people should be the maximum number on a committee



The most successful clubs are those that know how to properly separate their governance from their operations.

THE BASIC RESPONSIBILITIES OF ALL COMMITTEE MEMBERS:

- Read and be familiar with your constitution
- Understand the conditions under which the club is affiliated to your peak body
- Understand your club's purpose why you exist
- Set the club's strategic, long-term direction in your strategic plan
- Attend all committee meetings and meetings of members, including being well prepared and playing an active role in the club's decision making
- Keep a close eye on the club's financial position at all times
- Engage proactively with members
